## Principals Report/Updates

> Project Lead the Way - update and explanation of PTA funding request

- Funds will need to be available in early June
- \$17,000 will buy one I-Pad lab and Exxon will match with another I-Pad lab
- The principal and two other teachers will be trained over the summer on the program
- All grade levels will be included in program
- The I-Pad labs will be able to be utilized for other things
- The corporate donor funds will cover "consumable kits" this year; however, they will need to be replenished next year
- The Tech Levy funds may be a way to cover this expense
- The Tech Levy was questioned as to where those funds went; was this Levy to cover electronic needs?
- \$25,000 was available per year
- New computers were bought for teachers
- A computer lab for every classroom is a goal
- Intention to spend the funds before the $6^{\text {th }}$ graders transitioned into Middle School as uncertain what next school year would bring
- Questions were brought up on how much the PTA should fund for Project Lead the Way
- $\$ 10,000$ was discussed in earlier budgeting meetings
- No decision was made at this time; we will address this in further meetings
> Middle School updates
- Two meetings have taken place on how the next year with the new Middle School will go
- Bitterroot had good attendance at the meetings
- John English was able to walk through the building of the new Middle School
- The second floor has science pods
- There is open room on the second floor like a foyer that has seats
- The school has pod areas
- All $6^{\text {th }}, 7^{\text {th }}$, and $8^{\text {th }}$ Grades will be in the Middle School
- They will be moving Earth Science to the $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade and $9^{\text {th }}$ Grade will have Biology
- They will be offering $9^{\text {th }}$ Grade Math to the $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade students
- High school graduation needs 22 credits

## Science Night (January 15): Committee Report/Updates

What worked well?

- 66 students signed up for the door prizes
- Keeping everything all in one place instead of all throughout the school
- Great group of volunteers including the Lego Robot Team
- Pipe cleaners were a huge hit
- Slime station was a hit
> How can we improve?
- Maybe use Project Lead the Way next year like Beartooth School did this year.
- More like a Science Project Fair

NOVA Theater (January 25 - February 5): Vacation on Mars - The Solar System for Young Explorer
$>$ What worked well?

- The students enjoyed it; some of the older students did not seem as engaged as before
- The $\$ 2,000$ cost covers the set, the props, the costumes, and the license for the play; this is a great value.
- Good feedback from the families
- Moving the stage to the opposite side of the gym (the end by the office) was a nice change. This allowed better acoustics for the audience.
- There were 49 students participating this year.
$>$ How can we improve?
- Working with Dan is "interesting." He has a different style of teaching. He teaches "life skills."
- The donation bucket was not set up as earlier discussed.

Read-A-Thon (February 24-March $4^{\text {th }}$ )
$>$ Kristine Gaskill is the Chair for this Committee
> Montana Air Cartage donated $\$ 500$ for the event
> Every student will receive a book that is grade level specific
> Every student will receive a key chain that looks like a crystal ball
> E-readers and gift cards to Barnes and Noble will be given by the same lottery system that was used last year; the students will get their choice in the order they are drawn
> Kristine has many gift certificates/coupons for the students as they reach specific goals
> The top 4 readers will receive a $\$ 10$ gift card to Denny's
> The winning classrooms will be given a "secret envelope prize" \& cookie tray that has been donated

- Kristine will get with each teacher to find out what that specific classroom would like to have; i.e. PJ Day.
> The library is in need of non-fiction books (Ms. Anderson just recently purchased 9 non-fiction books that cost $\$ 600$ )
$>$ Jenny Jasper made motion that $100 \%$ of proceeds (minus expenses) go to the library. Kristine Gaskill second the motion and the motion was passed.
